This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentage of students in Prep to Year Six achieving 'C standard or above' in English from 80% in 2016 to 85% in 2017
- Increase the percentage of students achieve an A or B in English to 40%

Our initiatives include

- Develop teacher capability in implementing quality teaching and learning strategies within the school pedagogical framework, leading students to successful independent application of learning.
- Develop teacher clarity of the P-10 Australian Curriculum content descriptions and achievement standards by designing and supporting rigorous alignment processes for unit planning, teaching, assessment and reporting
- Develop teacher capability to use evidence driven instruction to analyse specific evidence of learning and to plan relevant instruction for student assessment tasks.
- Develop teacher capability to monitor learning, to ensure that all students are progressing towards successful completion of assessment tasks.
- Extend our literacy intervention program into year three to six.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Procure full-time Head of Curriculum FTE (additional 0.6) to lead teacher capability in high yield teaching practices.
- Employ a Support Teacher – Literacy and Numeracy to support and monitor teacher capability in high yield literacy practices (0.4FTE).
- Employ additional teacher aides to extend literacy intervention into year three to six.
